

OCTA's Express Bus Service

Enjoy a stress-free commute when you join OCTA for their limited-stop express service. These routes begin at [park-and-ride facilities](#) where you can leave your car and travel to popular business centers in Los Angeles and Orange County. These routes use freeways, have fewer stops and operate only during peak morning and afternoon times Monday through Friday.

Express Routes

Three routes offer express service:

- [Route 701](#) begins at the Goldenwest Transportation Center in Huntington Beach and travels along the 405, 605, 105 and 110 freeways to a destination at the Patsaouras Transit Plaza in downtown Los Angeles.
- [Route 721](#) begins at the Fullerton Park-and-Ride and travels along the 91 and 110 freeways, to its destination at the corner of 5th & Beaudry in downtown Los Angeles.
- [Route 794](#) travels between Riverside and Corona to the South Coast Metro area.



OC Express Routes

Providing express bus service within Orange County, choose from five OC Express Routes:

- Route 206 – Santa Ana to Lake Forest
- Route 211 – Huntington Beach to Irvine
- Route 212 – Irvine to San Juan Capistrano
- Route 213 – Brea to Irvine
- Route 216 – Costa Mesa to San Juan Capistrano

Metrolink's Bike Cars



Metrolink has new Bike Cars to accommodate more bikes on select trains. The lower levels of the new Bike Cars are equipped with multiple stalls that are designed to hold three bikes each. Bike Cars are identified by a yellow "Bike Car" decal on the side of the train.

Bikes are allowed on **ALL** Metrolink train cars and each train car is designed to hold three bikes. These special Bike Cars are designed to hold 9 bikes on the lower level.

Bike Guidelines

- Bikes must never block aisles or doors and must be secured in the bike storage area
- Bicyclists must follow the conductor's instructions to relocate or board an alternative car due to overcrowding and/or if space is needed for a passenger in a wheelchair
- Battery-powered scooters and wheelchairs are permitted
- Folding bikes are allowed on the train and must be stored in the bike storage area

Metrolink Scheduled Change

Metrolink has changed the schedules on its San Bernardino, 91/Perris Valley and Inland Empire-Orange County lines.

San Bernardino Line: In preparation for the San Bernardino Line's extension to the new San Bernardino-Downtown Station later this year, all weekday arrival and departure times for trains to and from the current San Bernardino Station will be adjusted by up to five minutes. Weekday trains 314, 316 and 331 will also have slight changes to departure times from stations along the route.

91/Perris Valley Line: Weekday 91/Perris Valley Line train 701 will depart Fullerton, Buena Park and Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs two minutes later to avoid conflicts with Amtrak service, while allowing the train to continue to arrive at Los Angeles Union Station at 7:05 a.m. There will be no changes to the 91/Perris Valley Line weekend schedule.

Inland Empire-Orange County Line: In preparation for the Inland Empire-Orange County Line's extension to the new San Bernardino-Downtown Station later this year, all weekday arrival and departure times for trains to and from the current San Bernardino Station will be adjusted by no more than five minutes. Also, weekday train 803 will depart Anaheim Canyon and Orange up to five minutes earlier to improve service. The train's remaining station arrival and departure times will not change.

Amtrak Rail to Rail®: As part of Metrolink's [Rail 2 Rail® Program](#), which allows Metrolink Monthly Pass holders along the Orange and Ventura County corridors to travel on Amtrak Pacific Surfliner trains at no additional charge, riders will see changes of up to 11 minutes to seven Amtrak trains (Amtrak 761, 763, 565, 567, 769, 777 and 562).
